FULL-TEXT CATEGORIES AND AUTHOR GUIDELINES

Word limit: **7500 words** (should be no longer than eight pages, including figures and tables)

- The title of the full text, authors' names and affiliations should be written as explained and shown in the example below.
- The title should be written in sentence form, with all the words beginning with a capital first letter.
- The surnames of the authors should be written in all capital letters.
- The authors' affiliations should be given a superscript number, which will be written in full in a separate line, beginning with the department's name, followed by the faculty, university, city and country.

1. Original Articles

THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE TEXT: The full text of the original articles should include **the Abstract, Introduction, Material and Methods, Results, Discussion, Conclusion, References, Tables and Figures.** The number of tables and figures should not exceed **more than 8 in total** and should be placed where relevant and appropriate within the text. The **table legends** should be written **above the tables**, and the **figure legends** should be written below the figures using Arabic numbering. No further typesetting or paper design will be available for publication in the abstract book of the congress.

- The abstract should include the following subheadings: Aim, Methods, Results, and Conclusions and be no more than 250 words.
- **The introduction** should be brief and end with a statement of the aim of the study or hypotheses tested. Describe and cite only the most relevant earlier studies. Avoid the presentation of an extensive review of the field.
- **Material and methods** should be clearly described and provide enough detail to evaluate the observations critically and, if necessary, repeat them. Authors must provide a statement confirming that all studies involving human participants or

animals were reviewed and approved by an appropriate **ethics committee** or **institutional review board**, in accordance with relevant guidelines and regulations. The name of the committee, along with the approval number and date, must be clearly stated in the manuscript. Section subheadings in a logical order to title each category or method should be used. This order should also be followed in the results section. The methods and tests used for statistical analysis must be described clearly and carefully. The confidence interval (CI) should be given.

- **Results** should clearly and concisely report the findings, and division using subheadings is encouraged. Tables and figures should not include data that can be given in the text in one or two sentences. The p values according to the statistical analysis should be presented.
- **The discussion** section presents the interpretation of the findings. This is the only proper section for subjective comments and references to previous literature. Avoid repetition of results; do not use subheadings or references to tables in the results section.
- **Conclusion:** the most important results obtained from the research should be written briefly in this section.
- **References:** Maximum 40.

2. Case Reports

THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE TEXT: **Abstract**, **Introduction**, **Case report(s)**, **Discussion**, **Conclusions**. The number of tables and figures should not exceed more than 8 in total and should be placed where relevant and appropriate within the text. The **table legends** should be written **above the tables**, and the **figure legends** should be written below the figures using Arabic numbering. No further typesetting or paper design will be available for publication in the Congress abstract book

- The abstract should include the following subheadings: Introduction, Case Report, and Conclusions and should be NOT more than 250 words.
- A short Introduction about the disease or the condition presented in the case report
- **Case report** itself (a brief description of the patient/s, presenting condition, any special investigations and outcomes);
- **The discussion** should highlight specific aspects of the case(s), explain/interpret the main findings and provide a scientific appraisal of any previously reported work in the field.
- **Conclusions:** Final comments regarding the importance of the case regarding Paediatric dentistry.

References: Maximum 30.

References

• All references should be numbered consecutively in order of appearance and should be as complete as possible. In-text citations should cite references in consecutive order using **Arabic superscript numerals**.

Tables

- Tables should be self-contained and complement, not duplicate, the information contained in the text. They should be supplied as editable within the text, not pasted as images. Legends should be concise but comprehensive – _the table, legend, and footnotes must be understandable without reference to the text.
- All abbreviations must be defined in footnotes. Footnote symbols: †, ‡, §, ¶, should be used (in that order) and *, **, *** should be reserved for p values.
- Statistical measures such as SD or SEM should be identified in the headings.

Figure Legends

• Legends should be concise but comprehensive – ç.the figure and its legend must be understandable without reference to the text. Include definitions of any symbols used and define/explain all abbreviations and units of measurement.

Figures

- Figures should be included in formats, sizes, and resolutions of the highest quality possible.
- In the text, please reference figures as 'Figure 1' or 'Figure 2' to match the tag name you choose for the individual figure files included.
